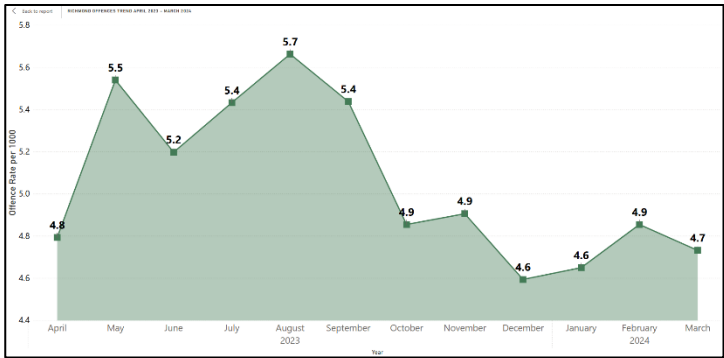

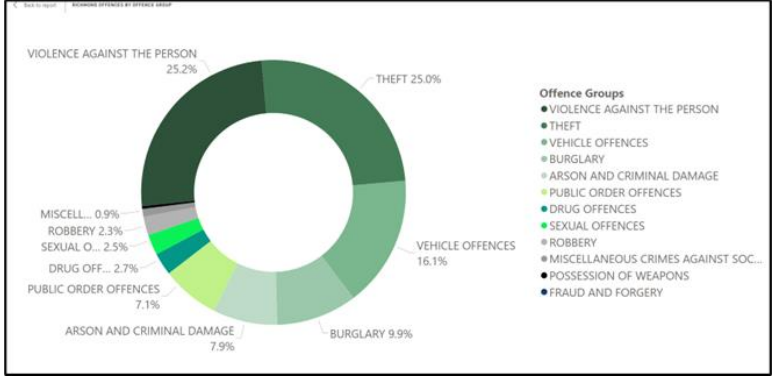
General Trends

During this period there is a significant decline from August 2023 to the lowest recorded overall crime in December 2023. This further highlights the low level of crime in the borough.

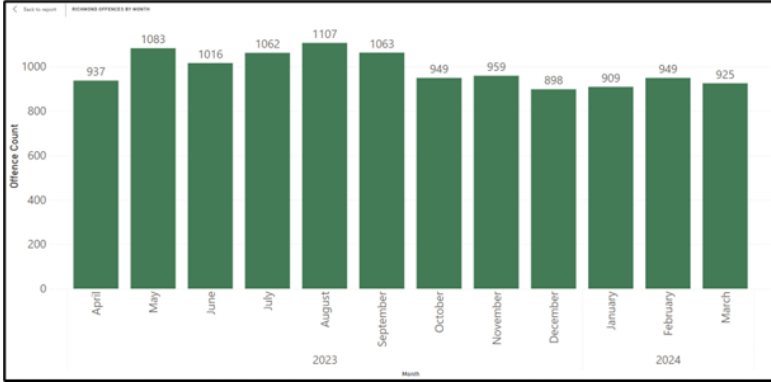
Proactive problem solving plans and local policing initiatives continue to support crime reduction activities with partners and communities.

Seasonality

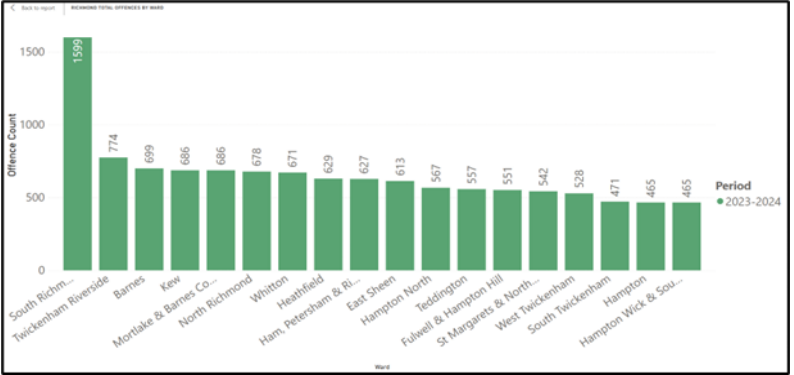
There is no evidence of significant increases or decreases across this period, the average offence rate is 988 for all recorded crimes.

There is a slight increase in May 1083 and the summer month of August 1107, then decline in September 1063 offences. In line with seasonal trends, improved weather.

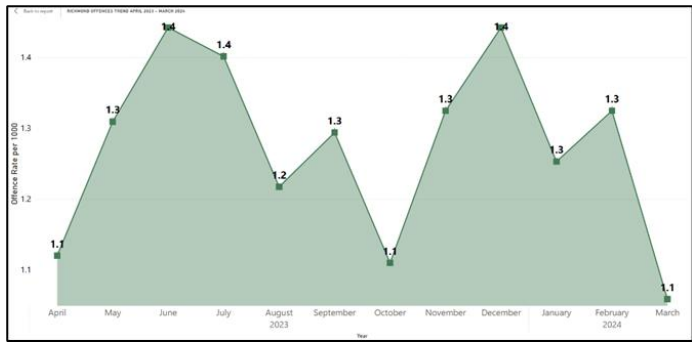

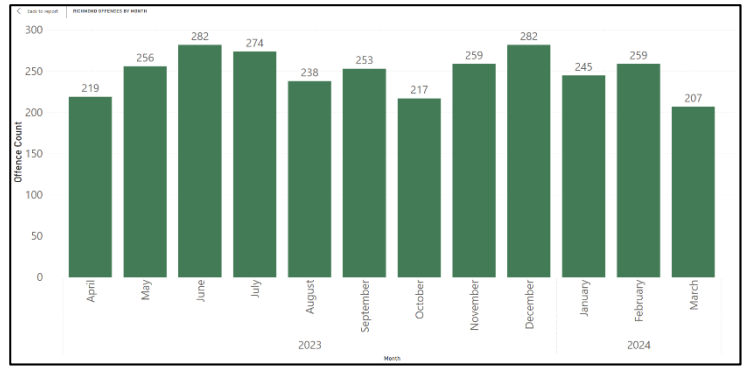
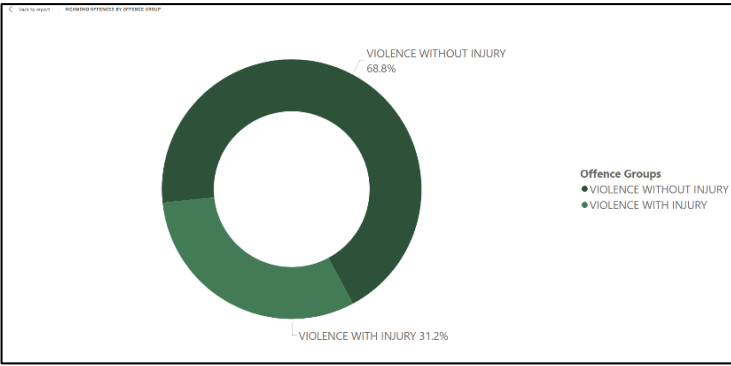

Seasonality

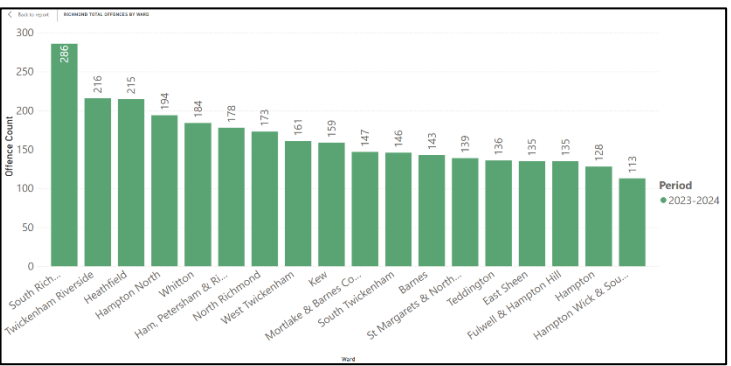
There is evidence of seasonal increases and decreases across this period, the average offence rate is 249 for all Violence against the person recorded crimes.

There is an increase in June 282, higher in the summer months then the next highest period in December 282 offences. In line with seasonal trends, improved weather and accessing winter festivities. Another possibility is increased social periods during this time.

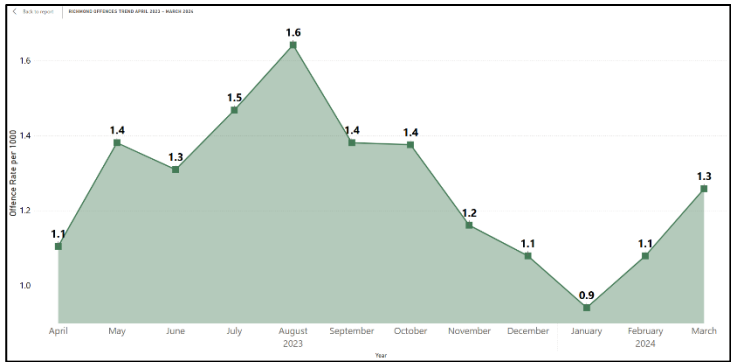

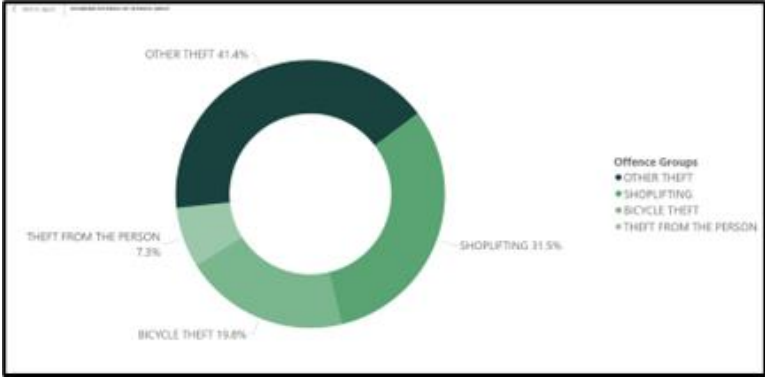

During this period there is a significant decline from August 2023 to the lowest recorded Theft in January 2024. This further highlights the low level of crime in the borough.

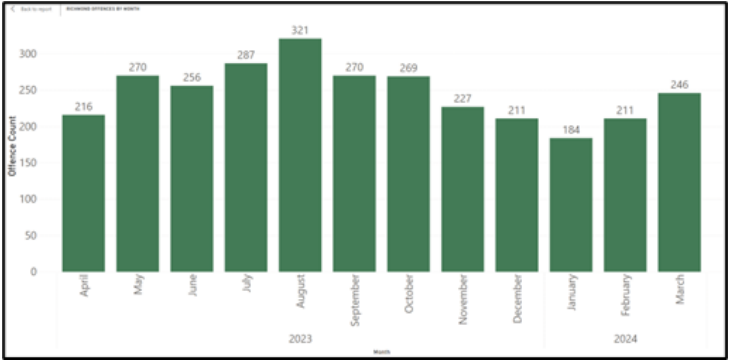
Proactive awareness raising and local initiatives continue to support crime reduction activities with partners and communities.

Seasonality

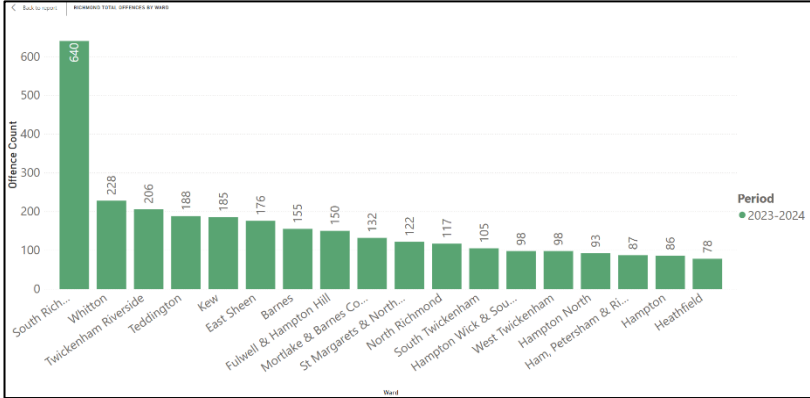
There is evidence of seasonal increases and decreases across this period, the average offence rate is 247 for all Theft recorded crimes.

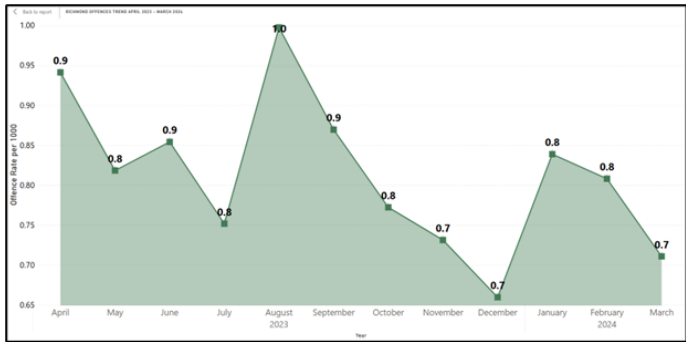

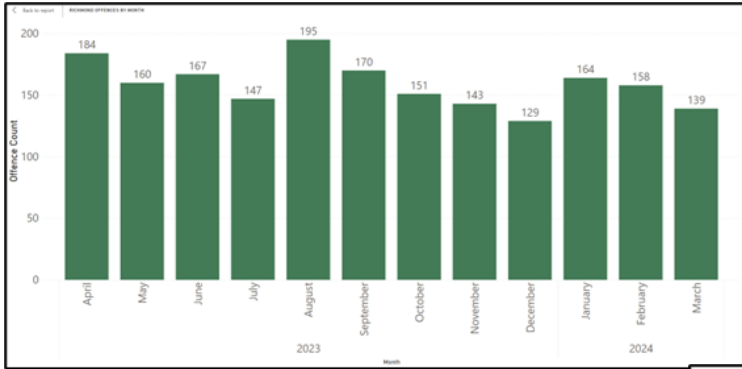
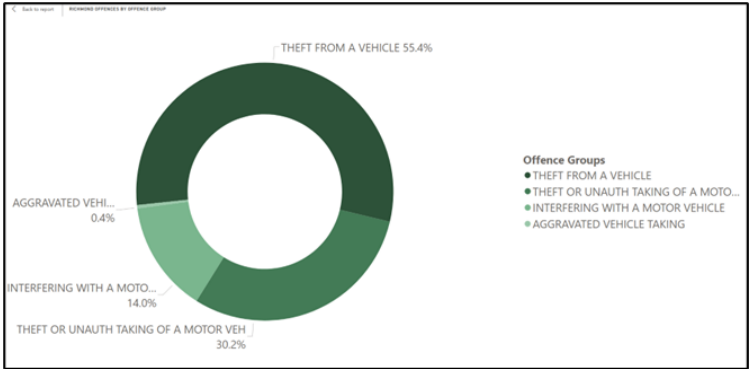
The top 2 offences in this period are Theft from a Vehicle, Theft or unauthorised taking of a motor vehicle, accounting for 85.6% of offences.

Interfering with a motor vehicle accounts for 14% of the remaining offences.

During this period there is a significant decline from August 2023 to the lowest recorded Vehicle crime in December 2023. This further highlights the low level of crime in the borough.

Continued local policing initiatives support crime reduction activities with partners and communities with Community Safety awareness campaigns.



Seasonality

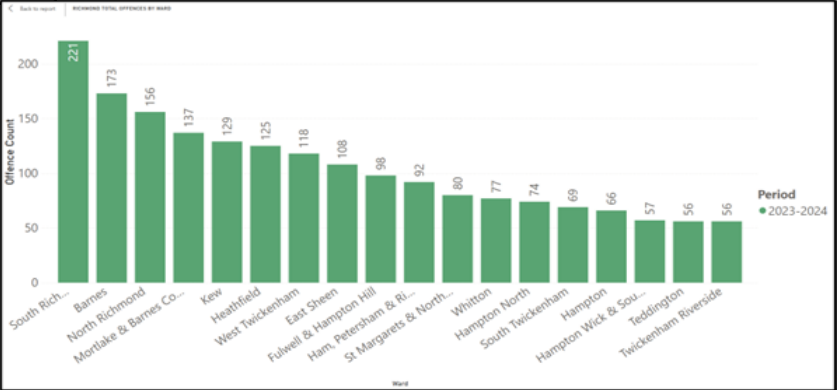
There is evidence of seasonal increases and decreases across this period, the average offence rate is 159 for all recorded Vehicle offences.

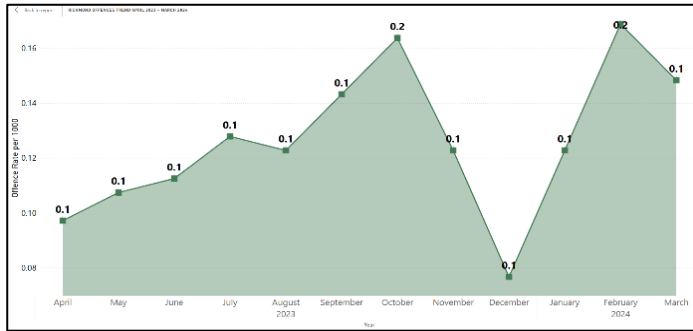

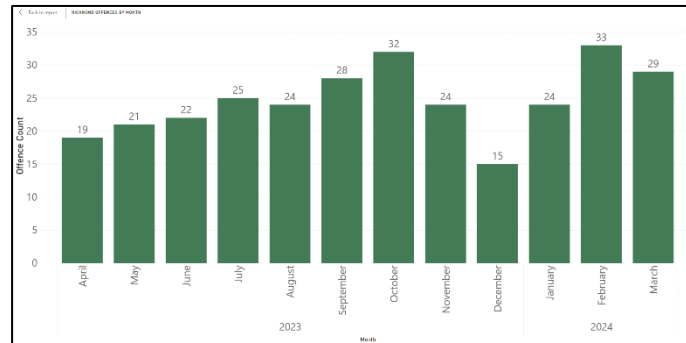
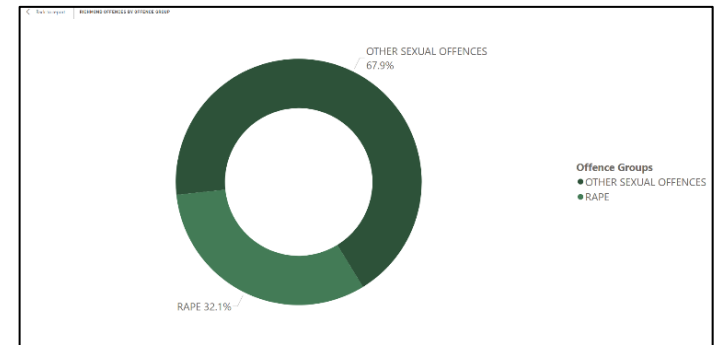
During this period there is a significant decline from October 2023 to the lowest recorded overall crime in December 2023. The lowest recorded Sexual offences across this period.

Seasonality

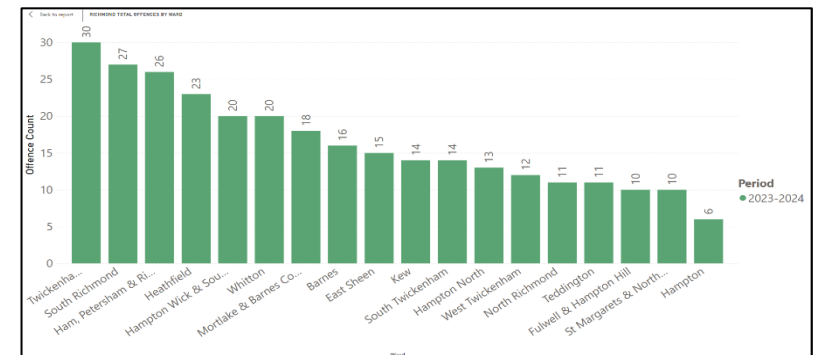
There is evidence of gradual seasonal increases and a significant decrease across this period, the average offence rate is 24 for recorded Sexual offences.

The highest period of recorded offences is February 2024, following an increasing trend up into the summer months then declining to the lowest period in December 15 offences. Seasonal trends, improved summer weather seeing an increase and decreasing with the declining weather approaching the winter months.

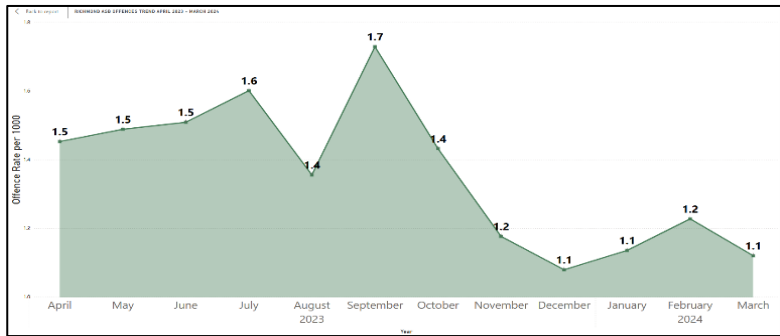

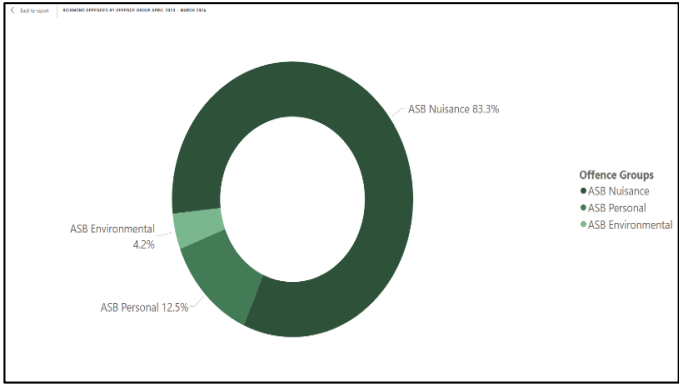
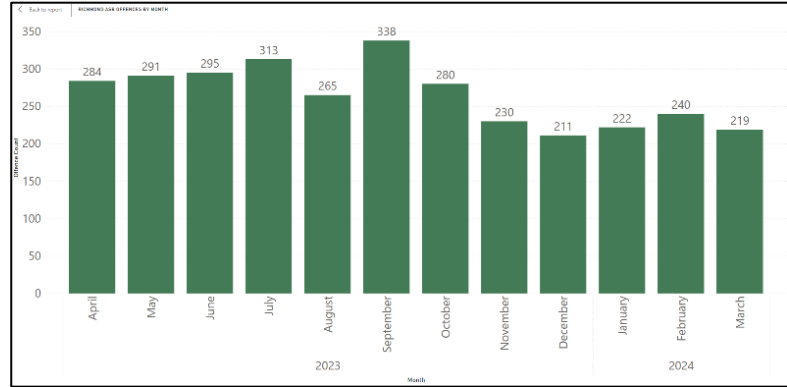
During this period there is a significant decline from September 2023 to the lowest recorded overall crime in December 2023. The lowest recorded ASB across this period.

Proactive area based Community Safety problem solving plans, raising and targeted work through the Community MARAC with our police and partners have supported the reductions.

Seasonality

There is minimal evidence of seasonal increases and decreases across this period, the average offence rate is 265 for all recorded ASB offences.

The highest recorded offences were in September 338, with the lowest period being in December 211. Possible seasonal trends aligned with, improved spring and summer weather. With lower periods of ASB across the winter period.

The top offence in this period is ASB Nuisance, accounting for 83.3% of offences.
