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What's this about?

Richmond clinical commissioning group (CCG) and Richmond Council are embarking on a project to develop better care and support for individuals and communities in the area. We want to make these services better so they are designed around the outcomes that matter most to people in our community. We are carrying out targeted research with users to help inform a user-centred approach to health and social care provision.

Who is running it?

Richmond CCG and Richmond Council have commissioned a research company (Innovation Unit) to conduct interviews and drop-in sessions with people who use community health and social care services to understand how these can be improved for them and others. This research will inform the co-design sessions with real-life experiences of people who use and need them most. The Innovation Unit is a not-for-profit organisation which works with public sector organisations and communities across the UK to design better public services.
