**Implementation of new controlled parking zones in Teddington  
York Road/Somerset Road re-consultation**

In March 2022 I wrote to you to update you on the Council’s decision to implement new controlled parking zones (CPZs) in Teddington and preparations are underway aiming to bring these new schemes into operation later this year.

The Council is also reconsulting this area on whether to implement a new CPZ **in part or all of this area**. The results of previous consultations in this area in 2020 and 2021 showed support for a new controlled parking zone to be introduced to operate Monday to Friday 10am – Noon. You may recall that these consultations were across all roads east of Stanley Road, between Strathmore Road and Broad Street (originally Zone T3). Following a review of the results and feedback received, it has been decided to carry out the following comprising two new CPZs:

1. Seek feedback from all properties of roads approximately south of, but excluding, Somerset Road on proposals to implement a new CPZ (Zone T3) operating Monday to Friday 10am – Noon.
2. Re-consult all properties approximately north of, and including, Somerset Road on whether they would wish to have a new CPZ (Zone T6) implemented operating Monday to Friday 10am – Noon.

Your property falls within the area described in (2) above – see the attached map. If there is support for a new CPZ in part or all of this area, we will seek to establish the most appropriate boundary taking into account the results of this consultation. For practical reasons we usually place CPZ boundaries at road junctions. Depending on the results of this consultation we may introduce a new CPZ (Zone T6) in part or all of this area or extend neighbouring CPZ(s) to include parts of this area.

Please note that we are not reconsulting as to the hours/days that a new CPZ introduced will operate given the results from the last consultations showing support for a two hour a day, five days a week zone.

**Resident and Business permits**

The above resident and business permit prices are for the first permit issued per household/business for one year. Subsequent permits purchased per year are approximately 50% more for the second permit and 50% more again for the third permit issued.

### Resident visitor permits

Resident visitor permits (scratch cards) are available at half the standard price to the over 60s. These permits must be validated for the relevant time period.

Some of the feedback received from the last consultation in October 2021 concerned the provision of parking spaces across the area. The Council will design its CPZs with the aim of maximising parking capacity, noting the current parking patterns but placing priority on ensuring the safe and unobstructed access for all vehicles, including emergency service vehicles. At junctions and narrow sections of roadway, it is considered necessary to designate these restrictions. However, following a further review of the detailed design of this scheme, the Council has been able to modify the design in York Road to increase its parking capacity in agreement with the London Fire Brigade.

Please be informed that the Council is to progress implementation of the double yellow lines contained within the latest CPZ design irrespective of whether a CPZ is introduced. In addition, when completing and submitting your questionnaire, can we ask you to consider the possible displacement effect that the **new schemes elsewhere in Teddington**, could bring to this area, in particular, Zone FW to the east and the proposed new Zone T3 to the south.


Please note that the responses will be analysed over the whole area as well as on a street-by-street basis meaning that a CPZ could be introduced in some roads and not others if appropriate. The Council would like to demonstrate that any measures have the support of residents so a good response is very important, although the Council will not base its decision on residents' wishes alone. All feedback to this consultation will be considered by the Council along with all relevant traffic management and other highway factors, prior to a decision being made on the way forward.
