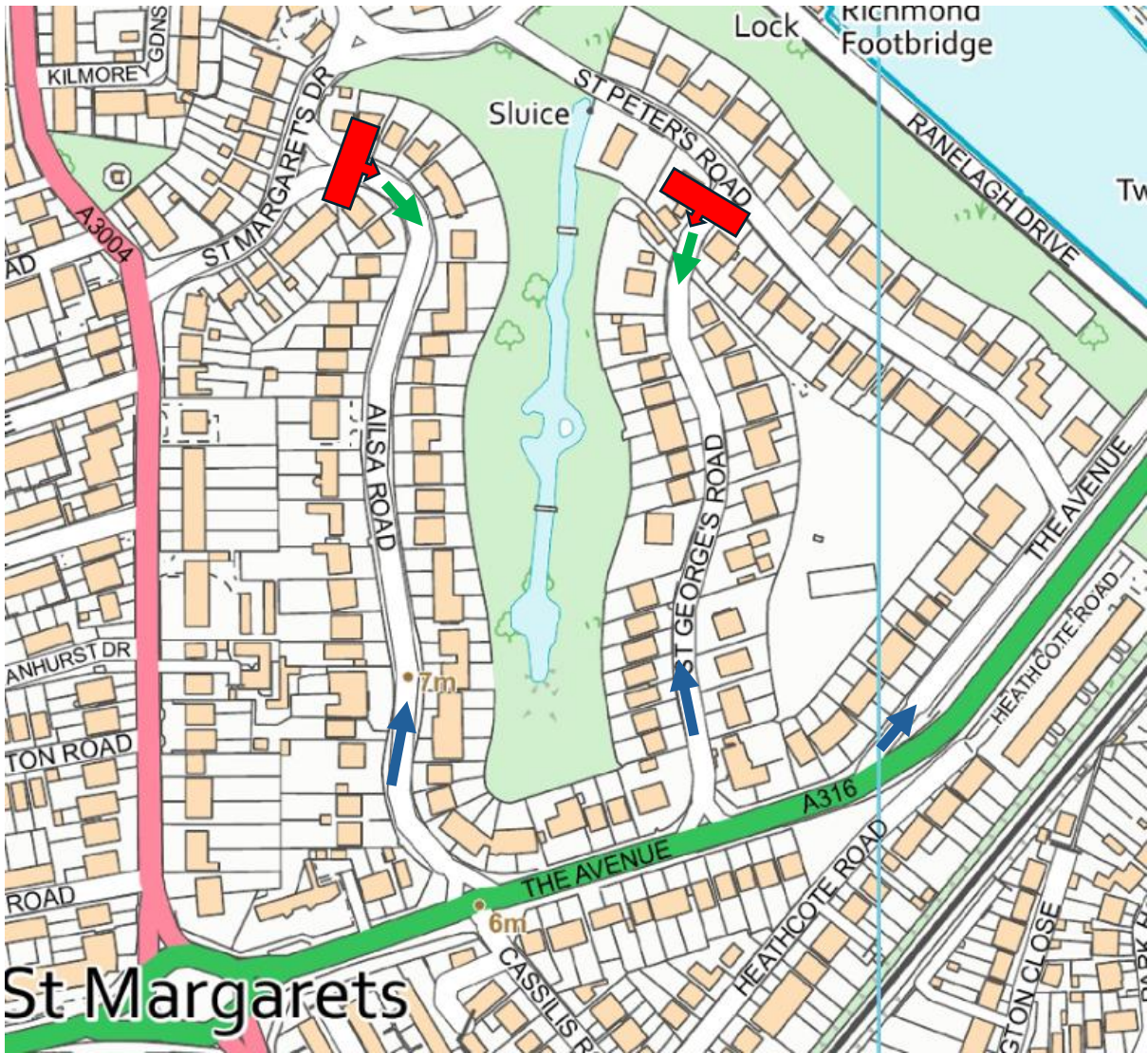


Option 1

The introduction of two NO MOTOR VEHICLE southbound restrictions 7am-7pm throughout the week on Ailsa Road & St George’s Road (EXCEPT PERMIT HOLDERS). The restriction would be ANPR camera enforced, with residents qualifying for a free of charge moving traffic electronic permit for this area. These are limited to four permits per household within the approved exemption area and all vehicles must be registered at that address. There would also be an allowance for those with carers duties to apply for an exemption. All visitors and deliveries could still access from the south via the A316.

Permit holders



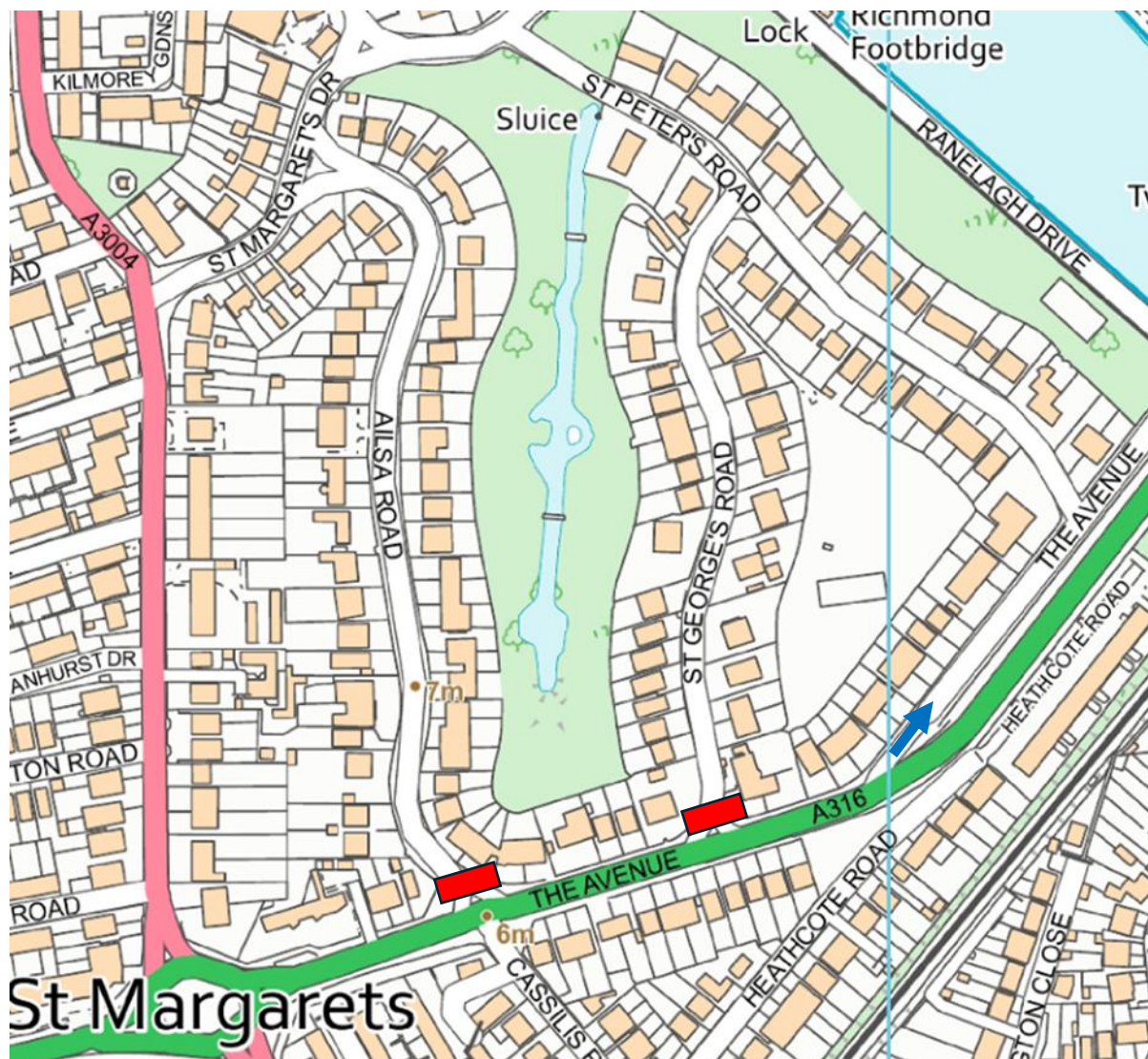
All traffic (including permit holders)

BENEFITS – Existing resident access maintained & rat-running traffic discouraged

DISBENEFITS – Visitors and deliveries will have to take alternative routes 7am-7pm

Option 2

The introduction of two physical closures on Ailsa Road & St George's Road at its junction with the A316 (subject to TfL approval). This would prevent all traffic from turning on/off the A316 except for cycles.

Full physical closure – no access for all vehicles except cycles



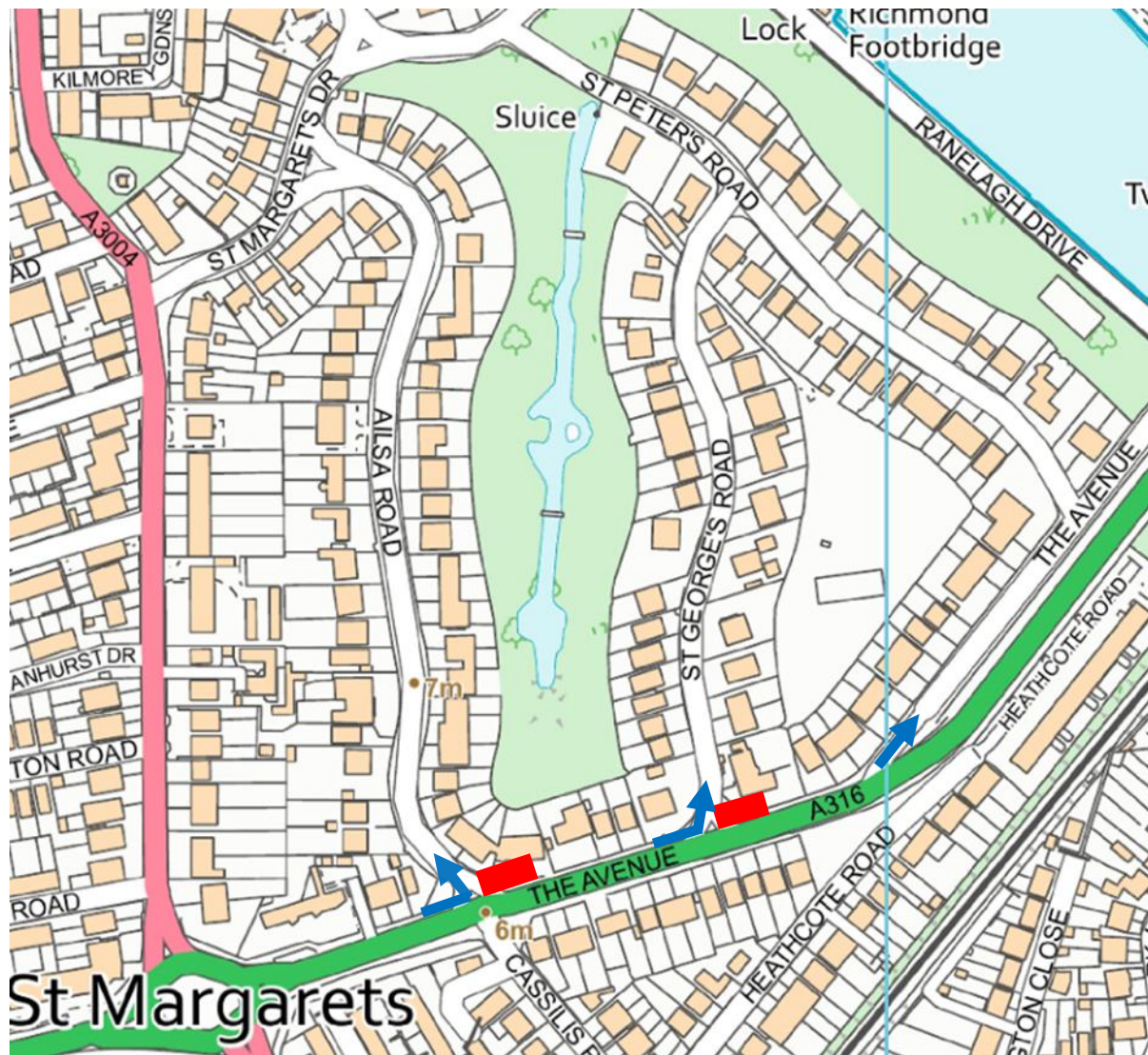
All traffic

BENEFITS – Self-enforcing restriction – no resident exemption permits required

DISBENEFITS – All traffic (including residents) may have to take alternative/congested routes to enter/leave the Ailsa Road area

Option 3

The introduction of two partial physical closures on Ailsa Road & St George's Road at its junction with the A316 (subject to TfL approval). This would allow London bound traffic on the A316 to turn off into Ailsa & St George's Road (but not join it).

Partial physical closure – No access on to A316 for all vehicles except cycles

BENEFITS – Self-enforcing restriction – no resident exemption permits required

DISBENEFITS – All traffic (including residents) may have to take alternative/congested routes to enter/leave the Ailsa Road area
