## Teddington Controlled Parking Zone (Zone T) Review – Re-consultation

In March 2022 I wrote to you to update you on the Council's decision to implement new controlled parking zones (CPZs) in Teddington and to update you on the ongoing review of the existing Teddington CPZ (Zone T).

As part of the review of Zone T, we re-consulted all properties in this CPZ in July 2022 on what hours/days it should operate in the future. This was because the last consultation showed a difference of view amongst residents on these hours/days – specifically on whether they should apply 8.30am to 10.30am, Monday to Friday (existing CPZ hours/days) or for a longer period of 8.30am to 10pm, Monday to Saturday which is currently in place in the Christchurch Avenue/Station Road area.

The results of this re-consultation showed support for longer hours in Cedar Road and the section of Bridgeman Road (between Station Road and Cedar Road). As a clear boundary of this cluster of roads can be formed, this change to this part of Zone T will be implemented in the New Year but these roads will remain in Zone T for the foreseeable future.

We are now re-consulting you - the residents of Bolton Gardens, Gomer Gardens and Gomer Place on whether you wish to be added to Zone T operating 8.30am to 10.30am, Monday to Friday as per the adjacent roads Field Lane, Blackmores Grove and Springfield Road.

If support exists for any of these roads to join Zone T, it/they will be added to it in 2023.

The current costs for parking permits for Zone T are as follows:

The above resident and business permit prices are for the first permit issued per household/business for one year. Subsequent permits purchased per year are approximately 50% more for the second permit and 50% more again for the third permit issued.

## **Resident visitor permits**

Resident visitor permits (scratch cards) are available at half the standard price to the over 60s. These permits must be validated for the relevant time period. For two hour CPZs, only one permit is required validated for the morning period.

If parking is required in the section of Zone T where longer hours/days are applied, this will require two resident visitor permits to be validated which will cover the whole day and evening parking periods.

Some of the feedback received from the last consultation carried out in this area in October 2021 concerned the provision of parking spaces. The Council will design its CPZs with the aim of maximising parking capacity, noting the current parking pattens but placing priority on ensuring the safe and unobstructed access for all vehicles, including emergency service vehicles. At junctions and narrow sections of roadway, it is considered necessary to designate double yellow lines (no waiting 'At Any Time' restrictions). However, following a further review of the detailed design of this scheme, the Council has been able to reduce the length of proposed double yellow lines in Gomer Place to increase its parking capacity.

Please be informed that, irrespective of the outcome of this re-consultation, the Council will be going ahead with the implementation of the double yellow lines. We therefore ask you to consider how you feel these changes may affect your area when providing your feedback.
