Wandsworth Town Hall Voluntary and Community Sector (VCS) Hub

Following recent feedback from the voluntary sector and as part of the council's commitment to partnering and supporting local Voluntary and Community Sector (VCS) organisations, the council has identified 1,700sqft of ground floor space, with the potential use as a VCS Hub.

This space will be in a town centre location, where local VCS organisations can connect, collaborate and network.

The council wishes to engage with the local voluntary and community sector organisations, to hear their views and to explore piloting the provision of a VCS Hub at Wandsworth Town Hall.


To understand further how the new space could be most useful for local organisations and to gain insight into how other co-working spaces have worked, there will be two ways organisations can give feedback to shape this new space.

Following this feedback, the council will explore options and refine the workspace proposition to ensure its fit for purpose.

The ground floor map right, highlights it is fit for purpose workspace in grey, which is situated on the ground floor, Fairfield Street.


Town centre proximity

The next step is to test demand and refine the layout/offer through engagement with the local Voluntary and Community Sector.

At present the space is designed to provide a range of touchdown workstations and flexible meeting/collaboration space. The meeting rooms in the centre of the workspace can also be opened into one large event space.

This is a new concept for the council as it seeks to open up the town hall space to other users.

We are engaging with the VCS at an early stage to understand what their workspace needs are and how the council might operate the space, including booking solutions and what costs might be appropriate to ensure it is sustainable.

The space is estimated to be available from Autumn 2024.

The space has independent access on Fairfield Street, the current proposal includes:

12 Bookable touchdown workstations

4 large meeting rooms (can be opened out into one large collaboration space)

1 medium sized meeting room

Informal meeting POD

Guest wifi access

Lockable storage units

Access to toilets and kitchen area
