## Management recommendations

Each management recommendation has been given a number for reference. Those which relate to specific locations on the Common are shown on the map, the rest apply to the Common as a whole.

### **TREES**

- 1 Maintain and manage individual trees, avenues and groups of trees to provide a balance between the open space and planted areas of the Common.
- 2 Consider the historic treescape in terms of species selection and planting patterns.
- 3 Continue programme of regular and systematic tree risk assessments.
- 4 Extend life of older trees by carrying out tree surgery/remedial work.
- 5 Explore options for external funding for woodland management activities.
- 6 Promote the development of species and age diversity within the woodland.
- 7 Control holly and bramble, retaining some as a source of food and cover for wildlife.

### **ECOLOGY**


- 8 Improve habitat connectivity by relaxing mowing regimes and creating further areas of native planting.
- 9 Manage and increase acid grassland habitats.
- (10) Naturalise the banks and increase marginal vegetation to improve diversity of wetland habitats.
- Improve terrestrial habitats adjacent to the lake/wetlands and pond through relaxing mowing regimes, tree/scrub planting and log piles.
- (12) Control ornamental and invasive species.
- Use barrier planting and mowing to manage visitor footfall across Common.
- (14) Reduce light-spill from lighting across the Common onto sensitive habitats such as woodland, wetlands and grasslands.

## HYDROLOGY


- Following the outcome of the borehole trials on Bolingbroke Fields in June 2018, consider extending this management to other areas with similar issues.
- Manage water levels in the lakes and Three Island Pond during prolonged dry weather.
- (17) Increase marginal planting to help filter out any chemicals.
- Reduce or cease use of herbicides on the football pitches to prevent pollution in Three Island Pond.
- (19) Maintain surface drains and gullies around the Café complex.
- (20) Explore options for aeration of the wildlife and fishing lakes.

# Key management opportunities

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### **ACCESS**

- Ensure the Common is accessible for people of all abilities through the provision of level surfaces.
- Develop an interpretation scheme across the Common to engage and educate visitors.
- Revise fencing pinch-points around Skylark Café / tennis courts.
- Consider a new north-south mixed use cycle route to improve access across the Common and to local stations, looking at a possible route adjacent to Bolingbroke Fields.
- Adopt a pallette of furniture for the Common for future replacements of benches, bins or signage.
- Ensure arrival experience at Wandsworth Common station reflects the character of the Common.
- (27) Consider creation of a natural play trail in this area.

### **VIEWS**

- Restore views through lime tree avenue on Prison Banks by removing vegetation and fence line.
- (29) Maintain tree avenues and tree lines within the Common.
- Maintain vegetated screens along Northside Field and Westside to screen noise and pollution.

### **BUILT STRUCTURES**


- Club

  Consider opportunities for alternative use of buildings, such as the Bowls Club Pavilion when it is not in use by the Bowls
- (32) Restore the Windmill and open up surrounding landscape.
- (33) Ensure the adequate maintenance and repair of buildings on the Common.

## LAND USE

- Consider removing sports use from Bellevue Fields and reserving it for informal recreation and small-scale events, and improve wildlife habitats.
- Consider moving the Wandsworth Common Ground play area into the area north of the Tennis Courts to reduce the conflict between pedestrians and vehicles.
- (36) Restore the drinking water fountain by the Skylark Café and investigate appropriate locations for a second fountain.
- Ensure the existing footprint of the Common is preserved and managed as one site.
